My Mother

"Please come in," said my mother. She welcomed her unexpected guests with a smile and led them into our home. She talked with them a little while and then went into the kitchen. I didn't realize I had my role model with me my whole life.

My mother was a tiny, shy, and humble lady. She wasn't pretty, but she was always neat and clean and had a smile. She never got an education because in her generation girls weren't allowed to go to school in Korean society. But she was a smart, kind woman. Everybody wanted to be her friend. To her this is more important than knowledge.

My father was an intelligent and educated man, but our mother's advice was more real and practical. When we made mistakes she never raised her voice at us or got a red face. She listened to us first and then told us what was wrong, explaining how to avoid the same mistake next time. Whenever we needed her, she was there for us. We never saw her sleep. It seemed like she never went to bed. As soon as we woke up, she was already dressed and cooking in the kitchen. When we went to bed, she stayed up sewing or preparing food for the next morning.

I guess my mother never knew how to hate people. A few years after she married my father, she had a daughter. So, my father found a concubine because he wanted a son. This new woman gave him several sons, but my father and mother never divorced. It was acceptable in Korean society at that time for a man to have a mistress if his first wife couldn't have a son. That was the culture in those days. So my mother accepted this situation as her destiny. She was patient, generous, and understanding. Instead of hating the concubine, my mother had sympathy for her and loved her. My mom was lonely without my father, but she never complained. She appreciated raising us, and focused on us as her priority. My father visited her once a month until he died in 1981.

In 1999, my mother passed away too. She was 83 years old. Now I feel awful that when I was a young girl, I hated my mom. I was embarrassed that my mom never had an education and that she lived like a single mother who had a part-time husband. And I was angry that we lost our father to a concubine. I blamed my mother for being weak and not getting a divorce. Now I am an adult woman and married with two daughters. I understand my mother's wisdom in that she loved my father and the concubine. I also realize that her loving passion was demonstrated to us throughout her life. I miss my mom so much. I will remember her passion and love toward everyone and I will practice those qualities just as she did.
